

Green Ash – May grow 60 feet high by 35 feet wide. Grows well in wet conditions. Glossy dark green compound leaves. Fall leaf colour is yellow. Hardy to zone 2.

Box elder (Manitoba Maple) – Grows 50 feet high by 30 feet wide. A native shade tree with compound leaves. Fall leaf colour is yellow. Hardy to zone 2.

Cottonwood, Siouxland (Seedless) – May grow 70 ft. tall, 30 ft. wide. Fast growing, hardy tree. Male clone is cottonless. Tall, spreading crown in open areas, but with a tall, central trunk when crowded. Resistant to leaf rust.

Caragana– Grows 12 – 14 feet tall and 8 feet wide. It is excellent for dry conditions, and makes a great hedge. Blooms with yellow flowers in early summer. Fall colour of leaves is yellow. Hardy to zone 2.

Cranberry, American highbush Grows 10-12 ft. tall, 8 ft. wide - Hardy native shrub. Attractive white flowers in summer, and red berries in fall. Also red-purple leaves in fall. Grows best in moist soil, and protected areas. Hardy to Zone 2b

Common Lilac – Grows 12- 16 feet tall and 9 feet wide. A vigorous suckering shrub that fills in spaces to provide privacy. Blooms in the spring with a lavender blue, fragrant flower. Hardy to zone 2.

Villosa Lilac – Grows 12-16 feet tall and 9 feet wide. A vigorous non-suckering shrub that makes a great privacy screen. Blooms later than other lilacs with light lavender flowers. Hardy to zone 2.

American linden – Grows 60 feet tall and 40 feet wide. A native species of shade tree well adapted to prairie conditions. This tree has large leaves and blooms in mid-summer with fragrant creamy-yellow flowers. Fall colour is golden yellow. Hardy to zone 2.

Amur Maple - A large, multi-stemmed shrub, or small tree, which may reach 15-20 ft.in height and spread. Noted for its attractive fall red to orange colour.

Oak, bur - Height 40 – 60 ft. width: 20 – 30 ft.
- Very hardy drought resistant and long-lived tree that can tolerate a wide range of soils. It has a very deep tap root which is not competitive with crops. It grows slowly the first two -three years, but can grow quite fast after the tap root is established. Hardy to Zone 2a

Poplar, hybrid (Oakanese)- Height: 60 ft. Width: 26 ft.
- a fast growing tree that grows best with adequate moisture. It can reach a height of 12-20 ft. within 4 years. They are short-lived in dry locations. Hardy to Zone 2a

Siberian Larch – grows 50 – 70 ft. tall, 20 ft. wide. This species does well in moist conditions. It is a deciduous conifer that has soft needles that turn bright yellow-orange in fall. Hardy to zone 2.

Sea Buckthorn – Grows 12 feet tall and 12 feet wide. Bears yellow flowers and orange fruit. Fall leaf colour is yellow. This shrub is salt tolerant and hardy to zone 2.

Willow, laurel leaf - Mature height: 26-50 ft. Spread: 50 ft. The leaves are distinctly dark green and glossy. Branches are not as prone to breakage as other willows. Not drought tolerant. Not alkaline tolerant. Tolerant of flooding.

Willow, Sharp-leaved (Acute) - 40ft tall x 35 ft. wide. A multi-stemmed large shrub or small tree. Hardy to zone 2a

Colorado spruce – Grows 50- 65 feet tall and 25 feet wide. It is tolerant of moist soil conditions but not standing water. Makes an excellent hedge or specimen tree but needs adequate moisture and protection in the first years after planting. Hardy to zone 2.

Black Hills Spruce - Grows 30-60 feet tall and 15 - 20 feet wide. A conifer that is suited to prairie soils and climate. Dark green foliage. Resistant to winter injury, and has few insect and disease problems than most spruce. Hardy to zone 2.

Scots Pine – Grows 45 to 60 feet tall and 20 to 25 feet wide. A fast growing green-needled conifer tree. Will tolerate both wet and dry sites. Hardy to zone 2.

Hackberry – Height: 80 ft., width: 25 ft. Similar to American elm, but resistant to Dutch elm disease. Flowers are small, greenish yellow. Medium growth rate. Deep purple, pea-sized berries are edible. Zone 2b

Saskatoon – height: 13 ft, Width: 9 ft. Tolerates a variety of growing conditions. Purple/blue edible berries. White flowers. Grows in partial shade or full sun. Zone 1a.

Pin Cherry – Height: 30 ft. Width: 16 ft. Fast growing. Edible red cherries. Reddish/brown bark. White flowers. Prefers full sun. Zone 2a

Chokecherry – Height: 23 ft. Width: 26 ft.. Fast growing. Astringent purple fruit. Prefers full sun. Susceptable to black knot. Zone 2b

Nanny Berry – grows 12 – 15 feet tall, 10 feet wide. Medium growth rate. Suckering. Spacing: 3 – 4 ft. Native shrub with large white flowers in spring, showy black/blue fruit in fall, and red fall foliage. Hardy to zone 2

Ohio Buckeye - Mature height: 50 ft. Width: 25 ft. Slow growth rate. Grows in all types of soil. Nuts or “conkers” are inedible. Does not do well on exposed sites. Brilliant orange-yellow fall coloration. Zone Hardiness: 2b

Lodgepole pine - Mature height: 100 ft. Width: 20 ft. Fast growth rate. Tolerates dry soil conditions. Grows in all types of soil. Comments: trunks were used as poles. Zone 1a

Sundancer Hybrid Poplar - Height: 40 ft., Width: 10 ft. A hardy, narrow, fast-growing seedless, disease – resistant poplar. Hardy to zone 2a

Golden currant – Height: 5', width: 4' Golden Currant is a winter-hardy, drought-tolerant, multi-stemmed shrub with clusters of fragrant, edible yellow flowers in spring, followed by juicy sweet-tart berries in summer. Zone 4a.

Golden Willow – Height: 50 ft. Width: 50 ft. Fast growth rate. Yellow bark and yellow fall colour. Zone 2a
