	TITLE: Road Signs	Department: Public Works

This policy supersedes all previous policies dealing with the same matters.

POLICY STATEMENT:

The Municipality receives numerous requests each year from residents requesting road signs.

Council acknowledges the wide variety of signs and uses that they may serve. While some signs will be paid for by The Municipality, other signs are to be paid for by the benefiting/requesting property owner.

Council has determined that a policy handling requests for signs be passed to ensure consistency & fairness when handling sign request.

PROCEDURES:

Regulatory Signs (stop signs, yield signs, reduced speed signs)

Appropriate signs will be installed at the locations as deemed necessary by the Municipality. The Municipality will endeavor to ensure the necessary signage is in place to ensure motorists are informed of possible dangerous situations. Resident requests for regulatory signs will be forwarded to Council for review & consideration.

Warning Signs (dead end road, narrow road, no thru road, t-intersection, rail tracks)

Appropriate signs will be installed at the locations as deemed necessary by the Municipality. The Municipality will endeavor to ensure the necessary signage is in place to ensure motorists are informed of possibly dangerous situations. Resident requests for warning signs will be forwarded to Council for review & consideration.

Construction Signs (RM Public Works construction only)

Appropriate signs will be installed at the locations as deemed necessary by the Municipality. The Municipality will endeavor to ensure the necessary signage is in place to ensure motorists are informed of possibly dangerous situations. This relates to RM of Stanley Public Works construction only. Private contractor signage is the responsibility of the contractor.

Pedestrian Safety (children playing, blind child, deaf child, school bus stop)

Requests for safety signs must be in writing on a form prescribed by the Municipality and will be brought forward to council for review and consideration.

If approved by council, costs for approved safety signs will be subject to an initial fee of \$100.00 payable to the Municipality prior to the sign being installed. Each year thereafter, a fee of \$25.00 will be charged to the benefiting property and is payable to the Municipality for each and every year that the sign is required. At such time as the sign is no longer required, the sign will be removed and the annual fee will cease.

Road Number Signs

Road number signs identifying the number of the road will be placed at each intersection along all-weather roads within the Municipality.

Personalized Road Names

Existing personalized road names are permitted to remain posted, however will not be replaced/repared by the Municipality. New personalized road names are not permitted.

Civic Address Signs

Each rural residential/commercial property will be provided with a civic address sign posted at the end of their approach.

Replacement signage (fading, vandalism, breakage, theft)

In situations where a previously authorized sign existed and requires replacement, the RM Public Works department is authorized to take the necessary action to replace the sign in a timely manner.

Sign requests will be reviewed by council with the following factors taken into consideration: (not limited to)

topography, speed of traffic, type of traffic, volume of traffic, blind spots, visibility, concentration of residences, type of road, previous incidents and any other factors that council may determine applicable.

All signage is to be installed by The Municipality.
